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# GRADE NINE REQUIRED AND COMPLEMENTARY COURSES

## GRADE NINE REQUIRED COURSES

### English Language Arts 9

English Language Arts 9 takes a process and theme oriented approach. This provides for variety, flexibility and student involvement. A variety of units are covered with practice in reading, writing, listening, speaking, viewing, and representing skills. To advance to English 10-1, it is recommended that students achieve a minimum of 60% in English 9. This course is yearlong.

### Mathematics 9

Mathematics 9 consists of the following units: Powers and Roots, Algebraic Equations, Polynomials, Circle Properties, Shape and Space, Transformations, and Data Analysis. To advance to Mathematics 10 Combined (Math 10C), it is recommended students achieve a minimum of 60% in Mathematics 9. This course is yearlong.

### Physical Education 9

PE 9 will focus on fitness, skills and the development of positive interpersonal skills. This activity course requires participation and the wearing of proper athletic dress. Shorts and t-shirts may be purchased through the school. Activities may include the following: Badminton, Basketball, Fitness Training, Football, Organized Games, Soccer, Softball, Team Handball, Track & Field, and Volleyball.

### Science 9

This is a general Science course that draws on the major scientific disciplines of Chemistry, Physics and Biology. Unit topics include: Biological Diversity, Matter and Chemical Change, Environmental Chemistry, Electrical Principles and Technologies, and Space Exploration. To advance to Science 10, it is recommended that students achieve a minimum of 60% in Science 9 and Math 9. This course is semestered.

### Social Studies 9

Grade 9 students will analyze the relationship between Canada's political and legislative processes and their impact on issues pertaining to governance, rights, citizenship, and identity. Students will also explore issues of economics and their impact on quality of life, citizenship, and identity in Canada and the United States. To advance to Social Studies 10-1, it is recommended that students achieve a minimum of 60% in Social Studies 9. This course is semestered.

### Teacher Advisory - Approaches to Learning 9

Each student is assigned to a Teacher Advisory Class that meets each Friday for 30 minutes. Our goal is to have students stay with the same Teacher Advisor for each of their four years at BCHS. **The teacher advisor is responsible for:**

- Mentoring and advising students
- Completing the basic outline of Students' Success Plans
- Monitoring attendance and discussing issues individually with students and parents
- Encouraging and guiding students to make responsible FLEX choices that best support learning.
- Communicating school announcements and grade level information.

### **Students are responsible for:**

- Attending Teacher Advisory
- Collaborating with their teacher advisors
- Accepting responsibility for choices and participating in plans for improvement
- Making responsible FLEX choices
- Bringing school work to Advisory to complete

### **Health and Life Skills 9**

The aim of Health and Life Skills 9 is to enable students to make well-informed, healthy choices and to develop behaviours that contribute to personal wellbeing and the wellbeing of others. Three general outcomes are the foundation for HPLS 9: Wellness Choices, Relationship Choices, and Life Learning Choices. As positive and productive citizens, we learn to make good decisions.

## **GRADE NINE COMPLEMENTARY COURSES**

**Courses will run ONLY if there is sufficient enrollment.**

**Fees listed are from 2019-2020 and are subject to revision for the 2020-2021 school year.**

### **Art 9 [90004a Fine and Performing Arts – Art 9] Cost: \$35**

Introduces the student to the artistic process. This program allows for experiential application of techniques using various mediums and exploration of art form, with research and design concepts being integrated throughout the program. There is an expectation for the student to explore their creativity and expand their skills. Critical thinking and aspiration is essential for student success.

### **Choir 9 [90004g Fine and Performing Arts – Choral 9] Cost: \$40**

Choir is a performance-based class and is open to students who enjoy singing and/or wish to improve their singing within an ensemble. Students are exposed to a wide range of musical styles. Attendance at all concerts and festivals is **MANDATORY**. Having some previous experience with singing is an asset, but not a necessity. Choir runs as a yearlong “J” block outside the regular timetable, from 7:30 to 8:50 am (2 – 3 days per week).

### **Communication Technology 9 [90016a CTS\_MDC Communication Technology 9] Cost: \$35**

We live in a world where visual communication is an essential skill. In this course, students will have the opportunity to explore all things multimedia. If you’re interested in photography, graphic design, electronic publishing, animation or video production, then this course is right for you! Using industry standard software and professional equipment, students will create a variety of multimedia projects that will give them the foundations for the high school Photography and Video Arts courses.

### **Cosmetology 9 [90015b CTS\_HRH Cosmetology 9] Cost: \$45**

Cosmetology 9 is designed to introduce students to the fashionable world of hairstyling and esthetics. This option will explore personal and professional grooming techniques as well as the following esthetic and hairstyling practices: basic nail art techniques used to enhance the appearance of fingernails, introductory hairstyling and personal hair-care tips and techniques, basic skin care practices to help students maintain the cleanliness of their skin and the creation of the students’ own salon. Cosmetology 9 provides students with an opportunity to explore the topic through project based learning, helping to prepare them for the practical and creative aspects of the high school Hairstylist Apprenticeship program. This course is largely based in a classroom environment.

**Drama 9 [90004c Fine and Performing Arts – Drama 9] Cost: \$10**

Emphasis is placed on the development of the student as a creator, performer, historian, critic and patron. Students will develop dramatic skills through assuming roles, exploration of dramatic situations and reflection on the outcomes (though no previous experience in Drama is necessary). Teamwork is essential, as students participate in non-competitive, cooperative, supportive, joyful, yet challenging, dramatic study. This course is recommended as preparation for grade 10 level Drama courses.

**Foods 9 [90015d CTS\_HRH Foods 9] Cost: \$45**

This is a basic Foods course covering areas such as safety and kitchen procedures (tools, measuring, food terms, reading recipes, etc.). Cooking topics and labs may include Canada's Food Guide, Breakfast, Lunch and Supper, and Snacks and Appetizers.

**French 9 [90011 French as a Second Language 9] Cost: \$10**

This course is intended for students who have taken or been exposed to French at some point and wish to continue developing listening, reading, speaking and writing skills. The language of instruction will be French as much as possible. Students who take French 9 will have a smooth transition into French 10.

**Note:** While French experience is recommended, it may not be necessary for motivated students. Please speak with [Mr. Nordoft](#) for more information.

**German 9 [90021 German Language and Culture 9] Cost: \$10**

This is a beginner's course for those students who want to learn basic German. If you already know English, then learning basic German is easy. This course focuses mainly on speaking and listening, with some emphasis on reading and writing. German 9 is recommended to prepare for German 10.

**Guitar 9 [90004b Fine and Performing Arts – Music 9] Cost: \$40**

Guitar is a performance-based class and is open to students who would like to learn how to play the guitar and to students who enjoy playing guitar already who wish to improve their playing. Students are exposed to a wide range of musical styles. Owning a guitar is **NOT MANDATORY** but it would certainly help you develop quicker. Class times are inside of the regular timetable and occur 2 to 3 days per week.

**Instrumental Music (Band) 9 [90004d Fine and Performing Arts – Band 9] Cost: \$50**

Students learn a variety of music styles, genres and facets in a wind instrument/percussion setting that promotes full band, ensemble and solo work. Techniques learned include sight-reading, listening, ear training, composition and evaluative performance. Skills learned in previous wind instrumental/percussion courses will be further developed. Class times are inside of the regular timetable and run yearlong. Performances are **MANDATORY**. (Students are encouraged to have had prior school band experience but there is always the possibility of learning a new instrument.) If you want to make some noise, JOIN THE BAND!

**Note:** A band instrument rental fee of **\$210** is applicable to students registered in a band program who rent a musical instrument from the Board. A \$50 caution fee is fully refundable upon return of the instrument in the condition in which it was rented.

**Leadership 9 [90015h CTS\_HRH Recreation Leadership 9] Cost: \$10**

Students in Leadership 9 will build their skills as leaders while becoming engaged within the community. They will learn about leadership and learning styles and how they impact group dynamics. Learners will discover what their strengths are as leaders and how to put those skills into action by planning and delivering lessons and working with students in our feeder schools.

### **Physical Education 9 Enrichment [90009e Physical Education Enrichment 9] Cost: \$40**

Physical Education 9 Enrichment is a course designed for students that are athletically inclined and enjoy participating in physical activity and fitness. The intent is to increase the amount of time being active throughout the school year. Ties to future sport-related endeavors may include exposure to Sports Medicine and Sports Performance, which can then be chosen as Grade 10-12 courses. Additionally, exploration of local off-campus activities will be part of the program.

### **STEM 9: Robotics [CTS\_BIT Robotics 9] Cost: \$45**

This course will introduce students to engineering design, drafting and computer programming. Throughout the course students will learn Oval, a C-based programming language. Students will design a series of engineering challenges and will program their robots to complete the tasks. This course is a great introduction to careers in STEM; no programming experience is needed!

### **Yoga 9 [90004k Yoga 9] Cost: \$25**

Yoga 9 is an introduction to the poses, postures and breathing techniques of Yoga. This course is designed to develop strength, flexibility and relaxation in students. This course is designed for students who are interested in combining disciplined physical training with breath work in order to improve focus, reduce stress and anxiety, increase flexibility, and promote overall wellbeing. No experience in yoga is required to take Yoga 9.

## **KNOWLEDGE AND EMPLOYABILITY GRADE 9 COURSES**

The core requirements consist of Language Arts, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies. These courses reflect the content of regular grade 9 courses, but within a functional, life skills and applied vocational context. In addition, students are encouraged to enroll in grade 9 complementary courses suited to their interests and needs (e.g. Art, Drama, Foods, and Music etc.).

### **myBlueprint**

myBlueprint is the foundational educational planning tool used during the students' four years at BCHS. All students will have myBlueprint accounts to assist with setting goals, tracking high school diploma requirements and exploring post-secondary options. School and Career Counsellors use myBlueprint to gather information on student needs and interests. This electronic tool facilitates planning by ensuring that students' educational interests and aspirations are known by school staff. The interactive component of myBlueprint provides students with an opportunity to plan their education. It is highly customized to meet curriculum expectations and learning outcomes and to build on opportunities and experiences related to occupational interests. Students build a forward-thinking plan and visually track school-specific completed in-progress and planned courses. The ability to create multiple "what-if" plans encourages students to explore options to meet their needs and interests. Students are offered the opportunity to explore a wealth of information on post-secondary opportunities across Canada, based on personal preferences and saved high school plans. Students can compare options side-by-side to save time and make the most informed decisions about the future.
